The number of people who gave or collected supplies for C2C this year TRIPLED, thanks in no small part to the Durham Rotary clubs who reached out to every corner of the Triangle to place collection bins and brought in SIX TIMES the value of goods collected in their drive compared to the previous year. Thanks to your help, we reached a landmark by giving away \$100,000 of supplies in 2012-2013. This report card shows that in many areas, we increased our productivity by well over 100% in just three years!

# C2C's Core Programs:

Monthly Shopping	Giveaway Events	Binder Blowout
Teachers from elementary schools with the highest free/reduced lunch rates are invited to pick out approximately \$50-\$75 of supplies once per month. They can come any Wednesday or Thursday afternoon or one Saturday per month.	Other elementary teachers are invited to attend at least one yearly Giveaway at which they can pick out about \$100-\$150 of supplies over the course of the three-day event.	Teachers from the entire Durham Public School system were invited to pick out binders, cardboard and poster board, spiral notebooks, file folders and desk organizers in September.
